Wanting to serve her country, CMDR Swinton joined the Royal Australian Navy as a full-time Legal Officer in 2007. She has enjoyed a diverse legal career, working a span of different roles across

Australia and overseas in the tactical, operational and strategic levels. CMDR Swinton predominantly provides legal advice on administrative, discipline and operational law matters, and enjoys working in the joint and coalition environments. She is a passionate advocate of International Law, Human Rights, and Gender, Peace and Security. Highlight postings for CMDR Swinton include serving as the Senior Legal Advisor to the Chief of Navy, where she received a Chief of Navy Gold Commendation and as the Chief of Staff to the Director General Military Legal Service.

CMDR Swinton has enjoyed an active operational career undertaking deployments as Legal Advisor and Gender Advisor in SLIPPER (2012) Australia's contribution to the war in Afghanistan; RESOLUTE (2014) Australia's Border Security operations; FIJI ASSIST (2016) the Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief following Tropical Cyclone Winston; and MANITOU as part of Combined Task Force 150 (2017), the counter-terrorism operation against drugs/weapons smuggling.

### **CAPTAIN DUSTIN WALLACE**

United States Indo-Pacific Command Staff Judge Advocate

Captain Dustin E. Wallace is currently the Staff Judge Advocate for United States Indo-Pacific Command. Captain Wallace earned a juris doctorate degree from the University of Tulsa in 2000 and a master of laws degree from Columbia University in 2011. Captain Wallace received his commission in 1998 and entered the JAG Corps in 2000 via the Student Program.

In February 2001, Captain Wallace reported to Naval Legal Service Office (NLSO) Central in Pensacola, FL. While at NLSO Central, he served as Defense

Department Head, Senior Defense Counsel and Legal Assistance Attorney. In August 2003, Captain Wallace reported to USS Harry S. Truman, where he served as Assistant Command Judge Advocate.

In August 2005, Captain Wallace reported to Naval Justice School in Newport, RI, where he served as the International Law Division Officer until October 2006. In October 2006, he reported to Task Force 134 in Baghdad, Iraq. While at Task Force 134, Captain Wallace served as the Senior Attorney for the greater Baghdad area at the Central Criminal Court of Iraq Liaison Office (CCCI). In May 2007, Captain Wallace returned to the Naval Justice School, where he assumed the duties as the Operational Law Division Officer and was responsible for the Iraq Pre-Deployment Legal Training Course.

From June 2008 until July 2010, Captain Wallace served as the Deputy Fleet Judge Advocate for Commander, U.S. Seventh Fleet embarked aboard USS Blue Ridge in Yokosuka, Japan. After his tour at Seventh Fleet, Captain Wallace attended Columbia University, where he earned his master of laws in international law.

In July 2011, Captain Wallace became the Senior Military Advisor to the Afghan National Army Legal School in Kabul, Afghanistan. As the Senior Military Advisor, Captain Wallace served as the Chief of Afghan National Army Legal Training and the Officer-in-Charge of the Coalition Forces Legal School Advisor Team. Captain Wallace redeployed in May 2012 and reported to Navy Personnel Command as the LT/LDO (Law) Detailer in June 2012, where he served until June 2014. From June 2014 until June 2015, Captain Wallace served as Executive Assistant to the Deputy Judge Advocate General and Commander, Naval Legal Service Command. From July 2015 until June 2017, Captain Wallace served as the Executive Officer of Region Legal Service Office Southwest in San Diego, CA. From July 2017 until July 2019, Captain Wallace served as Legal Counsel to the Vice Chief of Naval Operations. Captain Wallace then served as the Force/Fleet Judge Advocate for U.S. Naval Forces Central Command/U.S. Fifth Fleet from August 2019 until July 2021. Finally, Captain Wallace served as the Fleet Judge Advocate for U.S. Pacific Fleet from July 2021 until April 2024.

Captain Wallace is entitled to wear the Legion of Merit (3), Meritorious Service Medal (5), Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (3), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, and various other miscellaneous awards and decorations.

She was confirmed by the Senate on May 5, 2022. Ambassador Carlson is a career member of the Senior Foreign Service with the rank of Minister-Counselor.

She previously served as the Deputy Chief of Mission and Chargé d'affaires at the U.S. Embassy in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Prior to her assignment to Argentina, she served as Deputy Chief of Mission and Chargé d'affaires in New Delhi, India, and held the position of Principal Deputy Executive Secretary for the Secretary of State in Washington, D.C. A Foreign Service officer since 1985, she has served at U.S. Diplomatic Missions in China (twice), Ukraine, Hong Kong, Mozambique, Kenya, and the Dominican Republic. Her domestic assignments include Director of the Secretary's Executive Secretariat Staff and Deputy Director of Korean Affairs.

A native of Little Rock, Arkansas, Ambassador Carlson received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish and International Studies from Rhodes College in Memphis, Tennessee. She holds Master's Degrees from Georgetown University (International Relations) and the National War College (National Security Studies). She is married to retired Foreign Service officer Aubrey Carlson, and they have two daughters.

Gilberto C. Teodoro, Jr., is the Secretary of National Defense under the Marcos Jr. administration since 2023. He previously served in the same post from 2007 to 2009 under President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo. He has extensive experience in both the private and the public sector. He was Secretary of National Defense, a three-term Member of Congress, and a youth leader in his teens.

He practiced law and became a corporate executive. He was a key figure in the Nationalist People's Coalition and then became Chairman and Presidential Candidate of the Lakas-

Kampi-CMD Coaliton Party in the 2010 Philippine Presidential Elections.

### GENERAL ROMEO S BRAWNER JR.

Armed Forces of the Philippines Chief of Staff

Gen Romeo S Brawner Jr. took the helm of the Armed Forces of the Philippines as its Chief of Staff on July 21, 2023.

He is also the concurrent 65th Commanding General of the Philippine Army since 10 December 2021.

He entered the Philippine Military Academy in 1985 and earned his Bachelor of Science Degree, graduating salutatorian as a proud member of the Philippine Military Academy "Makatao" Class of 1989. During his senior year in the Academy, he led as the "Baron" or the Regiment Commander of the Cadet Corps.

He exemplified the highest levels of excellence in his military schoolings. In particular, he excelled in the Special Forces Operations Course, Intelligence Officer Course, and the AFP Comptrollership Course, graduating number (1) in his class. In 2011, GEN Brawner served as the representative of the Philippines during the United States Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP) on Cyber Security. He also attended the Advance Security Cooperation Course at the Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies in Honolulu, Hawaii. In 2022, he was invited as a speaker during the symposium on International Law Applicable to Urban Siege Warfare at the Harvard Law School in Boston, Massachusetts.

He also demonstrated the finest ideals of servant-leadership in his previous designations such as Company Commander of the 6th Special Forces Company; Battalion Commander of the 2nd Special Forces Battalion; Operations Officer of the Special Forces Regiment (Airborne); Chief of Staff of the 6th Infantry "Kampilan" Division; Chief, Public Affairs of the Philippine Army; Spokesperson of the Armed Forces of the Philippines; Commander of the Civil-Military Operations Regiment; and Brigade Commander of the 103rd Infantry Brigade during the aftermath of the Marawi Siege in 2017. GEN Brawner also served as the Commandant of the Cadets in the Philippine Military Academy and Commander of the 4th Infantry "Division.

GEN Brawner has acquired three (3) Master's Degrees — Master's in Information Management from the Ateneo de Manila Graduate School of Business; Master's in Business Administration from the Asian Institute of Technology in Thailand and from the European School of Management, Oxford, United Kingdom, and Master's in Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College (USAWC).

He was among those awarded in The Outstanding Philippine Soldiers (TOPS) in 2013 by the Metrobank Foundation and Rotary Club of Makati. In 2018, he was a recipient of the Award for Continuing Excellence in Service (ACES) conferred by the Metrobank Foundation.

In 2019, GEN Brawner is the recipient of several awards, including the Lapu-Lapu Award for his valuable contributions in the neutralization of Abu Dar, the Outstanding Citizens of Baguio for Professional Service for epitomizing the greatest standards of modern-day Filipino soldiery, the Malaysian Armed Forces Order for Valor in recognition of his dedication to bilateral relations between the Philippine Army and the Malaysian Armed Forces, and the U.S. Legion of Merit in recognition of his service as the Commanding General, Philippine Army, particularly in ensuring that the Philippine Army remains trained, ready, and postured for all missions.

### **ADMIRAL SAMUEL PAPARO**

United States Indo-Pacific Command Commander

Adm. Sam Paparo, a native of Morton, Pennsylvania, graduated from Villanova University and was commissioned in 1987. He is the son of a former enlisted Marine and the grandson of a World War II enlisted Sailor. He has earned a Master of Arts in International Studies from Old Dominion University and a Master of Science in Systems Analysis from the Naval Postgraduate School. A U.S. Naval Aviator, he is a TOPGUN graduate and has flown over 6,000 hours in the F-14, F-15 and F/A-18 and 1,100 carrier landings.

Operational command tours at sea include Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 195 in the Forward Deployed Naval Forces, Yokosuka, Japan, deploying in Kitty Hawk Strike Group; Commander, Carrier Air Wing 7, embarked in Dwight D. Eisenhower Strike Group and Commander, Carrier Strike Group Ten. On the ground, he commanded Provincial Reconstruction Team, Nuristan Province, Afghanistan, with the 3rd Brigade, 10th Mountain Division and the 173rd Airborne Brigade. Other operational assignments at sea include Fighter Squadron (VF) 14, flying the F-14 Tomcat with USS John F. Kennedy and USS Dwight D. Eisenhower Strike Groups, and VFA-15, flying the F/A-18 Hornet with USS Theodore Roosevelt and USS Enterprise Strike Groups. He served also on exchange duty with the U.S. Air Force flying the F-15C Eagle with the 71st Fighter Squadron, deploying multiple times to Saudi Arabia and Keflavik, Iceland. In joint operational service, he was Battle Director at the Combined Air and Space Operations Center, Al Udeid, Qatar.

Shore assignments include the staff of Commander, Naval Air Forces, as F/A-18 training, readiness and requirements officer. He served as commanding officer of VFA-106 and served on the Chief of Naval Operations staff as OPNAV N80 branch head. He served as executive assistant to Commander, U.S. Fleet Forces Command, and then to the 31st Chief of Naval Operations.

He was Director of Operations, J3, U.S. Central Command. He was Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Central Command/U.S. 5th Fleet/Combined Maritime Forces. His most recent assignment was Commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet from May 2021 to April 2024.

Paparo assumed duties as Commander, U.S. Indo-Pacific Command in May 2024. He is the 27th commander of the nation's oldest and largest combatant command. USINDOPACOM includes 380,000 Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Airmen, Guardians, Coast Guardsmen and Department of Defense civilians and is responsible for all U.S. military activities in the Indo-Pacific, covering 36 nations, 14 time zones, and 60 percent of the world's population.

Philippine Coast Guard

Commandant

Coast Guard Admiral Ronnie Gil Latorilla Gavan is a strategic, output-oriented, and people-person leader.

He is a graduate of the Philippine Military Academy ''Maalab'' Class of 1993. Admiral Gavan is also a holder of Master of Maritime Studies by Research Degree focusing on Philippine Maritime Border Security and the Law of the Sea from the Australian National Centre for Ocean Resources and Security, Faculty

of Law, University of Wollongong, Australia, and also studied National Security at the National Defense College of the Philippines, as well as Leadership and Governance at Harvard University Kennedy School of Government, USA.

His leadership was honed by his vast experience as Commander of various Coast Guard Districts and PCG major units and as Commanding Officer of PCG capital ships and BFAR vessels.

At the height of the COVID-19 Pandemic, Admiral Gavan led the very first PCG unit to assist arriving Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) and became the focal person and orchestrator of the PCG composite contingent to the Office of the President's "Hatid Tulong Initiative" for the Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs). He was also the first PCG Task Force Kalinga Commander who made the Task Force as the PCG's platform for Public-Private Partnership on Humanitarian and Disaster Response Operations.

Admiral Gavan also led the PCG Task Force Pagsasanay where the deployment of female radio operators or "Angels of the Sea" aboard PCG vessels to serve as voices of peace and rules-based order at sea was realized.

As a testament of all his accomplishments and significant contributions to the country and the Filipino people, Admiral Gavan received numerous medals and awards to include Distinguished Service, the Philippine Military Academy Cavalier Awardee for Coast Guard Operations in 2020, and the PMA Outstanding Achievement Award for having been appointed as the PCG Commandant. He is also the current Chairperson for the ReCAAP ISC Governing Council after being unanimously re-elected on March 2024.

The 30th Commandant of the Philippine Coast Guard is a son of public school teachers from the multicultural coastal town of Maitum, Saranggani Province. He speaks llonggo, Cebuano, and llocano, and draws strength in the comfort of his life with his wife, Coast Guard Commodore Lysamyra Marie Nonato Gavan, the Chief Nurse, PCG, together with their children Sandeon Mikhail, and Simone Miguel.

First Admiral TNI Frandinanto, ST, born in Bitung, Indonesia on February 26, 1972, is a prominent figure in the Indonesian Navy, currently serving as the Deputy for Law Enforcement in the Directorate of Data and Information at the Indonesian Maritime Security Agency (BAKAMLA). Frandinanto has built an impressive military career since his graduation from the Indonesian Naval Academy (AAL) in 1993. He has held numerous strategic positions throughout his career, including

commanding roles aboard KRI Yos Sudarso-353 and KRI Cut Nyak Dien-375, as well as key assignments in KOARMATIM and MABESAL.

Since 2022, Frandinanto's career has progressed rapidly. In early 2022, he served as Chief Advisor for Technology and Logistics in the Fleet Command of Armada II while participating in the PPRA LXIII course at the National Resilience Institute of Indonesia. In August 2022, he was promoted to Assistant Chief of Communications and Electronics (SKOMLEK TNI) at the Armed Forces Headquarters. In January 2023, Frandinanto assumed his current role as First Admiral of the Indonesian National Armed Forces, Maritime Security Agency, Deputy for Information, Law, and Cooperation, where he plays a critical role in safeguarding Indonesia's maritime security.

Frandinanto's academic background includes the Regular Education Program at the Indonesian National Armed Forces Staff and Command School, Class 43, completed in 2016, and the PPRA Class 63 at the National Resilience Institute of Indonesia in 2022. His dedication and strategic insight have earned him numerous honors, including the Bintang Yudha Dharma Nararya, Satya Lencana Wira Dharma, Satya Lencana Kesetiaan, and the UN Medal for his contributions in the UNAMSIL mission in Sierra Leone. Commodore Nye joined the Navy in 1993, graduating from the Australian Defence Force Academy in 1995. (2014-15).

Commodore Nye commanded Recruit Training School (2012-2013) and Sea Training Unit- Major Fleet Units (2016-2017)

He was awarded the Conspicuous Service Cross in the Queen's Birthday Honours 2018 for outstanding achievement in the field of Major Fleet Units Sea Training.

Commodore Nye is a graduate of the Australian Command and Staff College (2010), a distinguished graduate of the United States National War College (2019-20) and is a United States National Defence University Scholar (2020). He holds a Master of Arts in Strategy and Policy with the University of New South Wales, a Master of Maritime Studies with the University of Wollongong, and a Master of Strategic Studies with the National Defence University.

He also provided direct analytic support to top -level policy deliberations, including the presidential transition, as well as the Singapore and Hanoi summits with North Korea.

Garlauskas served for nearly twelve years overseas at the headquarters of United Nations Command, Combined Forces Command and US Forces Korea in Seoul. His staff assignments there included chief of the Intelligence Estimates Branch and director of the Strategy Division. For his service in Korea, he received the Joint Civilian Distinguished Service Award, the highest civilian award from the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Garlauskas holds a BA in History from Kent State University. He earned a Master's Degree from Georgetown University's Security Studies graduate program, where he is now an adjunct professor.

#### **CLEO PASKAL**


Foundation for Defense of Democracies Non-Resident Senior Fellow

The officer was closely involved in the fruition of the indigenous Combat Management System (CMS) and Data Link programmes of the Indian Navy. The



Carrie F. Ricci was confirmed by the United States Senate on December 14, 2021 and was sworn in as the 23rd General Counsel of the United States Army on January 3, 2022. As General Counsel, she is the chief lawyer of the Army ultimately responsible for determining the Army's position on any legal question. She serves as legal counsel to the Secretary of the Army, Under Secretary, the five Assistant Secretaries, and members of the Army Secretariat.

For nine years prior to her appointment, Ms. Ricci served as a Senior Executive with the United States Department of Agriculture, first as an Assistant General Counsel, then as the Associate General Counsel, Marketing, Regulatory, and Food Safety Programs, where she led a team that provided legal services to two Under Secretaries and three agencies. Her preceding assignment was as Assistant General Counsel, Office of General Counsel, Department of Defense Education Activity.

In 2010, Ms. Ricci retired from the U.S. Army after 20 years of active military service. At the time of her retirement, Ms. Ricci served as Assistant General Counsel, Office of the General Counsel, U.S. Army, where she advised the Secretary of the Army and other senior Army leaders on legal and policy issues concerning all areas of military personnel management. Other key military assignments include: Deputy Staff Judge Advocate, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command; Chief, International Law, U.S. Central Command (USCENTCOM); Administrative Law Attorney, Office of the Judge Advocate General; Trial Counsel and Operational Law Attorney, 4th Infantry Division; and Platoon Leader in Operations DESERT SHIELD and DESERT STORM.

Dr. Jill Goldenziel is a Professor at the National Defense University's College of Information and Cyberspace. She is also an Affiliated Scholar at the University of Pennsylvania's Fox Leadership International Program and Penn's Partnership for Effective Public Administration and Leadership Ethics.

Dr. Goldenziel's award-winning scholarship focuses on international law, lawfare, information warfare, U.S. and comparative constitutional law, the law of war, refugees and migration, and leadership. Her award-winning work has appeared in

the Cornell Law Review, the American Journal of International Law, the American Journal of Comparative Law, the Virginia Journal of International Law, the University of Pennsylvania Journal of Constitutional Law, and the Arizona State Law Journal, among other scholarly journals. Dr. Goldenziel is also a Forbes.com contributor on Defense and National Security and is frequently quoted and cited in the press.

Dr. Goldenziel is a sought-after speaker and consultant. She regularly advises elite Marine units, the Joint Force, Combatant Commands, and civilian agencies on lawfare and legal issues, and has briefed senior military and civilian leadership on her research. She received the 2022 Serge Lazareff Prize from NATO's Allied Command Operations Office of Legal Affairs at Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe for her work on legal operations (known elsewhere as lawfare or counter-lawfare). Since 2016, Dr. Goldenziel has had High-Level involvement in the processes to negotiate, create, and implement the UN Global Compact for Migration (GCM), as a representative of the Academic Council on the UN System. She spoke as the primary representative from academia at the 2022 UN International Migration Review Forum Stakeholder's Meeting, spoke alongside world leaders before 164 UN Member-States at the Intergovernmental Conference to Adopt the GCM, and submitted draft language for both documents and the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants.

Dr. Goldenziel was previously a Professor at U.S. Marine Corps University-Command and Staff College, a Climenko Fellow and Lecturer on Law at Harvard Law School, a Research Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School's Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs, a Lecturer on Government and Social Studies at Harvard College, and a Visiting Assistant Professor at the Boston University School of Law. She clerked for Judge Thomas Buergenthal (Ret., International Court of Justice) and Prof. William W. Park on ICSID investor-state international arbitration tribunals. She has been a Visiting Scholar at iCourts at the University of Copenhagen and a Scholar-in-Residence at the International Arbitration practice of WilmerHale in London.

Dr. Goldenziel holds a Ph.D. and an A.M. in Government from Harvard University, a J.D. from the New York University School of Law, and an A.B. from Princeton University.

Ursula Rakova is an environmentalist and climate change activist from Papua New Guinea. In 2008 she was awarded the Pride of PNG award for her environmental contributions to the development of her country. As executive director of the not-for-profit organisation Tulele Peisa, she is responsible for organizing the relocation of the inhabitants of the Carteret Islands to the mainland of Bougainville Province. The islands are expected to be uninhabitable by 2040, rendering Rakova's people the world's first climate refugees.

Rakova was born on the islet of Han in the Carteret Atoll. In 2005 she established a community schooling system in Bougainville as an alternative to the failed public school system. In 2006 she established Tulele Peisa to assist her people with relocation as the Carteret Islands were becoming increasingly exposed to sea level rise. The first settlement was established in Tinputz. Rakova has assisted in establishing several environmental NGO's in Papua New Guinea and Bougainville. She coordinated a landmark legal case whereby the Warangoi successfully sued illegal loggers and won compensation for their stolen forest resource. She established Bougainville Cocoa Net Limited to assist relocated Carteret Islanders with opportunities to produce fair trade cocoa.

## Brigadier-General Robert .F. Holman

Brigadier-General (BGen) Rob Holman was born into an Air Force family and grew up in a variety of locations across Canada and in Germany. After graduating from high school in Toronto, Ontario, he joined the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) in 1986 and attended the Royal Military College of Canada (RMC) in Kingston. Upon commissioning, he undertook basic and advanced flying training, receiving his pilot wings in 1991. He subsequently

From 2017 to 2020, as the Deputy Judge Advocate General for Operational and International Law, he was responsible for the provision of legal advice and services to all CAF international and domestic operations and to all Department of National Defence (DND) and CAF activities in the areas of national security and intelligence. In August 2020, he was appointed as Chief of Staff of the Office of the Judge Advocate General and Legal Branch Advisor, positions that he held until September 2022.

On 28 June 2023, he was appointed by the Governor General in Council as Canada's sixteenth Judge Advocate General. He serves as legal advisor to the Governor General, the Minister of National Defence, DND and the CAF in matters relating to military law, superintends the administration of military justice and commands the Office of the Judge Advocate General, an integrated team of almost 400 military and civilian professionals spread across Canada and around the world.
